AVV Health Centers History

AVV Health Centers was established in 2005 as a 501 c3 non-profit organization and became a federally qualified health center (FQHC) in 2009. We have grown to four locations and a mobile health care unit. AVV Health Centers serve Porter, Muskogee, Coweta and the surrounding areas. We currently have 8 medical providers and 2 licensed professional counselors.

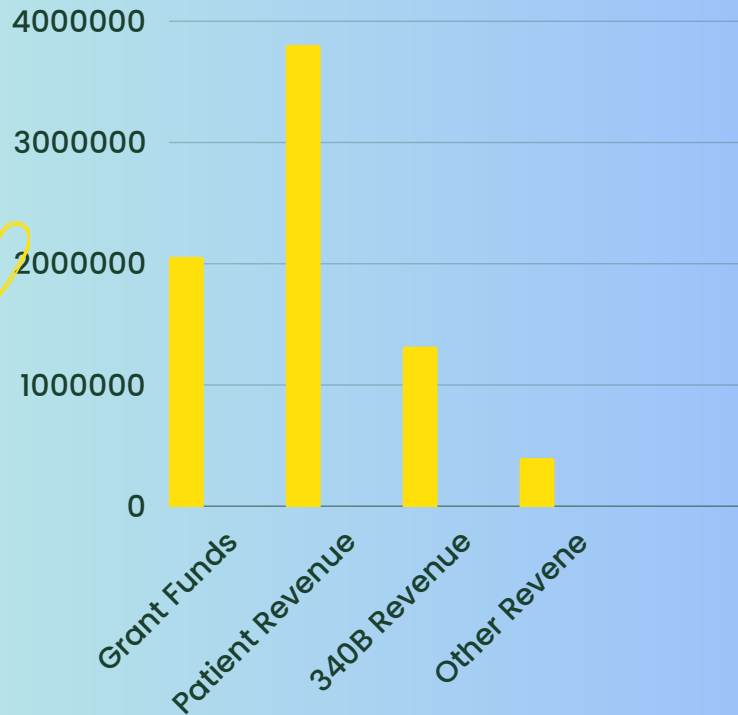

Website Improvement

AVV Health Centers updated our website in 2023 to add additional resources for our patients including service details, request for appointments, COVID information and access to the patient portal. On-line appointments will be implemented in 2024

Food Bank

AVV Health Centers implemented an on-site food bank at our Porter and Muskogee locations in 2023. Qualifying patients can receive food bi-weekly to help support their families' nutritional needs. AVVHC served 36 families in December.

COPD Packs

COPD packs are distributed specifically for patients with recent or frequent hospitalizations for moderate or severe COPD. These packs include educational information as well as an inhaler, short course of steroids and an antibiotic to be started if the patient develops respiratory symptoms or a diminished oxygen level as checked by a pulse oximeter also provided to the patient. AVV has observed a sharp decrease in the number of hospitalizations for COPD related illnesses over the last 6 months for these patients.

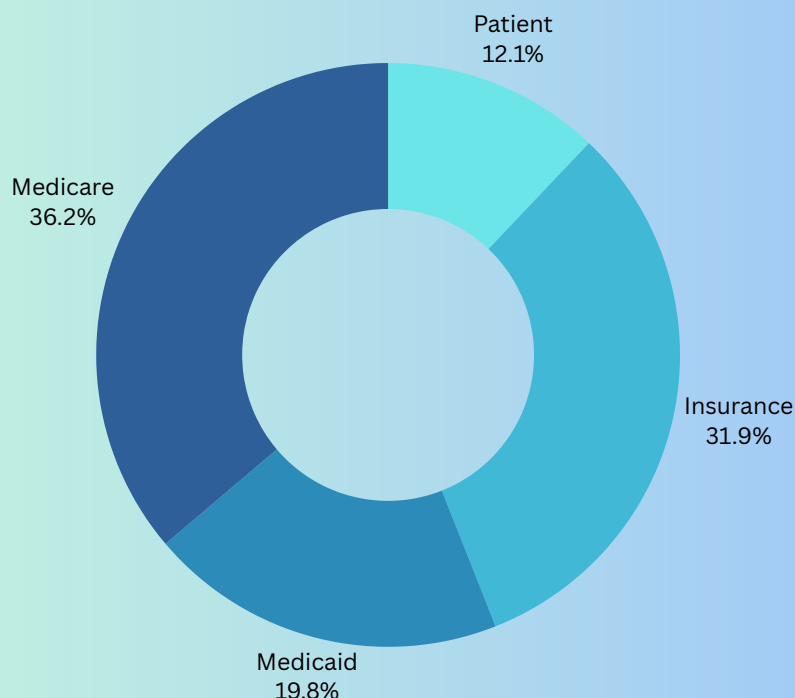
